



Policy and Procedures – Airedale Terrier Club of Canada (ATCC) Protocol For National Specialty

The ATCC National Specialty may be held following application for such being approved by a majority vote of a General Meeting of the ATCC and receiving CKC approval. Application for CKC approval and all other references to the event will be headed " ATCC National Specialty"

A hard copy request to hold a National Specialty Show should reach the ATCC secretary at least two years in advance of the proposed event. The Regional Director shall submit the request to the ATCC Secretary, stating the date, location, and name of Show Chairperson if possible.

It is preferred that an obedience trial be offered as well as conformation. Agility would be another consideration.

Upon approval from the ATCC, the Regional Director and/or the appointed Show Chair shall approach the show giving club for the list of terrier approved judges for selection and determining the date for the "Specialty". If show club judges are not available/acceptable, a member of the show committee shall solicit names of judges from the executive and the final selection will be made by majority vote of the executive. If time permits, the membership will be given an opportunity to vote.

All financial and hosting details of hiring of judge shall be made in writing and approved by the executive of the ATCC and the host Regional Director. A letter of agreement signed by the judge and the ATCC executive shall be filed.

Items that the ATCC will negotiate when hiring on outside judge:

- agreed judging fee
- transportation
- one/two nights accommodation,
- attendance at ATCC dinner and other standard items of hospitality.

ALL CKC GUIDELINES must be followed.

The administration and supervision of expenses will be the responsibility of the Regional Director holding the event. It is the expectation that this event will be financially self supporting.

The ATCC would expect to receive any and all rebate funds, a premium list, a schedule and a marked catalogue with the Airedale Terrier show results for the Club's statistics and newsletter.
